The **Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI)** is a global standard of transparency that requires oil, gas, and mining companies to disclose what they pay to the government, and the government to publish what they collect from these companies, for the open and accountable governance.



"We believe that a country's **natural resources belong to its citizens**. Our mission is to promote understanding of natural resource management, strengthen public and corporate governance and accountability, and **provide the data to inform policymaking and multi-stakeholder dialogue in the extractive sector**."

Importance of Transparency in the Extractive Sector





By making information about contracts, revenues, and payments public, it becomes harder for officials or companies to engage in corrupt practices



Transparency allows citizens and oversight bodies to track how much money is generated from natural resources and how it's being used by the government.



Open access to information helps citizens understand how their country's resources are being managed, fostering trust in government and industry.







Established by virtue of **EO No. 79, s. 2012** and **EO No. 147, s. 2013**



Admitted as an EITI candidate country on **22 May 2013**



Included under the **Philippine Open Government Partnership (PH-OGP) National Action Plan** since 2013



Operationalized by a Multi-stakeholder Group (MSG) from government, industry, and civil society with assistance from a National Secretariat







PH-EITI primarily works to achieve five specific objectives



Show **direct and indirect contribution** of extractives to the economy (through the EITI process)



Improve **public understanding** of the management of natural resources and **availability of data**



Strengthen **national resource** management and government systems




Create opportunities for **dialogue** and constructive engagement in natural resource management in order to **build trust and reduce** conflict among stakeholders


The **Extractive Data Generator or EDGe** features the following information:













Total Reconciled Government Receipts








Total Reconciled Government Receipts






Total Reconciled LGU Receipts






The Future of EITI Data

Digitalization and Data Mainstreaming

- Simplification through data visualization, this effort will transforms complex EITI data into easily digestible visual formats like charts, graphs, and interactive dashboards. This approach allows users to quickly identify trends, patterns, and anomalies in extractive sector information. By making data more accessible and intuitive, visualization enables a broader range of stakeholders - from policymakers to the general public - to engage meaningfully with the information.
- The PH-EITI is taking steps in the development of a centralized digital platform in collaboration with extractive companies and relevant government agencies. This innovative platform would streamline reporting processes, enhancing ease of doing business while simultaneously bolstering transparency and accountability in the sector.
- PH-EITI plans to provide a timely reporting by enhancing inter-agency coordination. This process involves creating robust communication channels and data-sharing protocols among various government bodies and industry stakeholders.
