EITI Gender Requirement

- Requirement 1.4** – Adequate representation in the MSG
- Requirement 6.3** – Contribution to the economy, particularly in employing women in the extractives
- Requirement 7.1** – Inclusion in public debate (the “style” and manner in which the report is written)
- Requirement 7.4** – Outcomes and impact should be gender inclusive

Women in Large Scale Mining in the Philippines: A Scoping Study

Recommendations:

- (i.) review and revisions of laws and policies towards integrating a gender dimension in all areas of regulation of the extractives
- (ii.) further research on gender-based barriers that exist in employment; the social and environmental impact of mining to women; and its contribution to alleviate poverty among rural women in host communities,
- (iii.) the companies should ensure equal opportunities in employment, and allow for inclusive participation of community folks, particularly women, in the development of gender-based and needs responsive community projects, and
- (iv.) local government units should ensure full and meaningful participation of rural women.
