






## **ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM**



Implementation of mitigation measures and addressing any identified environmental issues to minimize ecological impacts. MGB, LGUs and NGO representatives conduct verification if companies are complying with their environmental responsibilities based on the approved EPEP.

MGB together with the concerned LGU monitor the accomplishments on social development program based on the approved SDMP. The primary purpose of the Social Impact Assessment (SIA) is to bring a more sustainable and equitable biophysical and human environment.




