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1. Background

The Philippine Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (PH-EITI) has consistently demonstrated its commitment to transparency and accountability within the extractive sector. In 2023, PH-EITI expanded its focus, not only upholding these core values but also emphasizing the creation of a healthy environment for civic space participation. This strategic move highlighted the importance of diverse stakeholder engagement in the decision-making processes related to the governance of natural resources.

The theme for 2024, "Bridging Transparency: Strengthening Multistakeholder Collaboration in Natural Resource Governance," echoes this expanded commitment. The year ahead for PH-EITI is marked by a continued emphasis on transparent practices and active stakeholder involvement, which are seen as foundational to the governance of natural resources. The challenges and opportunities within the extractive industries are recognized as shared responsibilities, necessitating collaborative solutions.

The focus for 2024 is to build on the achievements of the previous year, particularly in enhancing multistakeholder collaboration. This approach is vital not only for sustaining transparency and accountability but also for ensuring inclusive participation in the governance of natural resources. Through its 2024 work plan, PH-EITI aims to strengthen partnerships, foster open dialogues, and develop inclusive strategies. These efforts are directed towards a transparent, accountable, and inclusive management of the extractive industries, contributing significantly to the sustainable development of the Philippines.

2. 2023 Work Plan: A Look Back

In 2023, the PH-EITI Multi-Stakeholder Group (MSG) diligently pursued its mission to promote transparency in the extractive industries, guided by four strategic objectives meticulously outlined in its annual work plan.

A critical objective of the 2023 work plan was "Strengthening Institutions and Linkages", which focused on sustainable and optimal implementation through robust partnerships along the extractive industries' value chain. This strategic direction manifested in several notable accomplishments.

The PH-EITI's MSG governance was marked by productive dialogues, which were facilitated through regular quarterly Multi-Stakeholder Group (MSG) meetings and targeted committee sessions. These interactions were pivotal for fostering cohesive decision-making and effective strategy formulation within the group.

A significant achievement in creating spaces for multistakeholder participation was the collaboration between the PH-EITI Secretariat and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources - Mines and Geosciences Bureau (DENR-MGB). Together, they compiled a comprehensive directory of Provincial/City Mining Regulatory Boards (P/CMRBs) across the Philippines. This effort went beyond mere data collection; it involved a thorough analysis of the composition of these boards to evaluate their potential in facilitating local-level EITI implementation.

Institutionalization was another key area of focus. The Secretariat closely monitored legislative developments, notably House Bill 06950, which seeks to officially establish the Philippine Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative. This bill is currently pending with the Committee on Natural Resources, marking a significant step towards formalizing PH-EITI's role and operations.

The subnationalization effort was highlighted by the Department of Finance's commitment under the 6th National Action Plan of the Philippine Open Government Partnership (PH-OGP). This commitment to integrating transparency and participatory governance mechanisms at the subnational

level represented a major advancement in promoting responsible natural resource management.

The Integrity program was a cornerstone initiative, targeting the identification and mitigation of corruption risks in the mining, oil, and gas sectors. Utilizing tools from the Natural Resource Governance Institute, the PH-EITI initiated an integrity study, financially supported by EITI International and led by consultant Dr. Ramandeep Kaur Chhina. The findings of this study became a crucial topic of discussion, laying the groundwork for heightened transparency and integrity in the extractive sectors.

Engagement with development partners was a focal point at the 2023 EITI Global Conference in Dakar, Senegal. Representatives from the PH-EITI Secretariat actively participated, contributing to global discussions on open data and transparent resource management. A subsequent meeting with the Intergovernmental Forum on Mining, Minerals, Metals, and Sustainable Development explored the possibility of implementing a pilot post-mining training program in the Philippines, further underscoring the PH-EITI's dedication to collaborative and sustainable development initiatives.

The PH-EITI identified "Mainstreaming Disclosures" as its second strategic objective. This was driven by the ambition to foster a culture of openness, ensuring that data related to the extractive sector is not only accessible but also utilized by a diverse array of stakeholders. This initiative underscores the importance of transparency in the realm of extractive industries, aiming to benefit research, policy-making, and public discourse, while also monitoring how the populace benefits from extractive activities.

A significant achievement under this objective was the production and publication of the PH-EITI's Fiscal Year 2021 country report. Themed "Recovery: Regaining Ground and the Need to Expand Civic Spaces," this report notably featured a special chapter dedicated to the engagement of civil society organizations (CSOs). Recognizing the integral role of CSOs in the EITI process, this inclusion highlighted the necessity of civic involvement in improving natural resource governance. The report comprehensively covered 71 participating companies, 22 local government units (LGUs), and 7 national government agencies (NGAs). It also detailed 23 revenue streams for mining and 15 for oil and gas, showcasing a thorough approach to transparency.

Systematic disclosure was another key area of focus. The PH-EITI Secretariat collaborated with the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) and the Bureau of Customs (BOC) to obtain data on company royalty payments to Indigenous Peoples' communities and on various revenue streams, including customs duties, VAT, and excise tax on imported materials. This initiative aimed at promoting transparency and accountability in royalty payments and tax contributions, ensuring that companies and governments honor their obligations. This data played a vital role in compiling the FY 2021 PH-EITI Report. Additionally, the PH-EITI embarked on enhancing the Extractive Data Generator (EDGe) through data visualization. This advancement transformed the presentation of extractive data from basic tabular formats to interactive dashboards, simplifying the communication of complex information. These visualizations are pivotal in fostering transparency, trust, and effective collaboration, enabling stakeholders to efficiently interpret and utilize vast datasets.

The PH-EITI also made strides in beneficial ownership transparency. In collaboration with the Opening Extractives (OE) Programme, a webinar on Beneficial Ownership Transparency was organized on April 25, 2023. This event was a follow-up to the EITI/OE mission from the previous November and aimed to pave the way for overcoming legal barriers to the public disclosure of beneficial ownership data.

Under its third strategic objective, "Enhancing Stakeholder Capacity," the PH-EITI focused on empowering stakeholders to effectively utilize extractive data and providing them with ample opportunities for discussion and analysis of this information. This initiative also emphasized the development of competencies and the enhancement of resources to improve stakeholder participation in the extractive industries.

One of the key accomplishments in this regard was the successful facilitation of multiple stakeholder engagement activities. A highlight was the Extractives Transparency Week, which coincided with the 10th anniversary of PH-EITI's establishment. This event included the Constituencies Meeting and FORGE PH: The PH-EITI National Conference, where stakeholders from various sectors were brought up to speed on current issues and given a platform to voice their concerns. Additionally, the PH-EITI organized a series of stakeholder consultations using a caucus-based approach to ensure focused discussions. These were aimed at communities directly involved in extractive activities, fostering informed public discourse and equitable benefit sharing from the extractive industries.

In terms of data utilization and communication, PH-EITI actively updated its online platforms, ensuring stakeholders were kept abreast of EITI implementations in the Philippines. Regular updates and content related to the extractive industry were shared across PH-EITI's social media accounts, while the PH-EITI website was diligently maintained for data accessibility.

A significant focus was also placed on gender inclusion. The PH-EITI analyzed data regarding the representation and participation of women and gender-diverse individuals in the extractive industry, aiming to inform industry and government recommendations for gender-based programs and policies. This analysis was part of the Country Report, with regular monitoring of sex-disaggregated data to understand gender dynamics and track progress on gender inclusion goals. Additionally, PH-EITI participated in the 2023 National Women's Month, promoting gender equality in the extractive sector through social media campaigns.

The PH-EITI also prepared a comparative matrix between DAO 2010-21 and the DILG study, facilitating collaboration with the Mines and Geosciences Bureau on the Social Development and Management Program (SDMP).

In addressing the global issue of energy transition, representatives from the PH-EITI Secretariat participated in discussions at the EITI Global Conference in Dakar, Senegal, demonstrating the Philippines' commitment to sustainable energy practices. Looking forward to 2024, the PH-EITI has included in its budget a proposal for Climate Change Expenditure Tagging (CCET) titled "Preparing Extractive Industries Towards Just Transition". This proposal outlines programs, activities, and projects designed to prepare communities, companies, and governments in areas hosting large-scale mining and energy operations for the impacts of energy transition. This comprehensive approach

aims to ensure a smooth and equitable shift towards sustainable energy practices in the Philippines' extractive sectors.

The PH-EITI placed a strong emphasis on its fourth strategic objective, "Monitoring Progress," recognizing the importance of measuring the outcomes and impacts of its initiatives. This objective was underpinned by the establishment of a robust monitoring and evaluation mechanism to track the progress of various activities.

One of the key areas under this objective was the implementation of EITI. The PH-EITI conducted an MSG Strategic Planning session, setting the direction for EITI implementation in the Philippines. This planning session was crucial for crafting both the annual and medium-term plans for PH-EITI. Additionally, during the Extractives Transparency Week (ETW), the PH-EITI commemorated the 10th anniversary of its formal creation through Executive Order 147 s. 2013, reflecting on a decade of progress and challenges.

Another vital aspect was addressing the decision from the EITI Board in 2022 when the Philippines achieved a moderate overall score in EITI implementation. The Philippines was advised to undertake corrective actions to address the identified gaps. To this end, the MSG worked to address the identified gaps, approving and diligently monitoring a plan to implement the necessary corrective actions to improve EITI implementation in the country.

A significant focus was also placed on enhancing the feedback mechanism. The PH-EITI noted limited engagement with the feedback form available on its website. To improve this, the Secretariat embarked on an improvement process, drawing insights from EITI International's grievance mechanism and recommendations from the Harvard Negotiation and Mediation Clinical Program (HNMCP). This revamped mechanism has already shown its efficacy, with five reports raised and discussed at the MSG level.

Documentation efforts also saw considerable progress. The PH-EITI developed and published the 2021 and 2022 Annual Progress Reports and ensured continuous updates and publications of matters arising from previous MSG meetings. The documentation and publication of stakeholder

engagement activities on the website were also a significant achievement, ensuring transparency and accessibility of information.

Some activities outlined in the 2023 work plan are still ongoing and have been carried forward into the 2024 work plan. This continuation underscores the PH-EITI's commitment to achieving its objectives and adapting its strategies to ensure the effective implementation of the EITI in the Philippines. The progress in 2023 lays a solid foundation for further advancements and refinements in the year ahead.

Strategic Objectives (Developed and approved by the PH-EITI MSG on March 23, 2023)

• Strategic Objective No. 1: Strengthen Institutions and Linkages

To ensure sustainable and optimal implementation, the PH-EITI will focus on building linkage and invigorating existing partnerships with all stakeholders along the extractive industries' value chain.

• Strategic Objective No. 2: Mainstream Disclosures

To strengthen a culture of open data, the PH-EITI seeks to ensure that extractive data is published and utilized by a broad spectrum of stakeholders. PH-EITI will continue to engage both extractive companies and relevant government agencies to publish information that are useful for research, policymaking, informing public debate, and monitoring of the benefits people receive from extractive activities.

• Strategic Objective No. 3: Enhance stakeholder capacity

The PH-EITI will focus on ensuring that stakeholders have the capacity to use data as well as sufficient and functioning spaces for the discussion and analysis of extractive information. The initiative will also cover the development of competencies and enhancement of resources to improve stakeholder participation.

• Strategic Objective No. 4: Monitor progress

The PH-EITI gives utmost importance to measuring the outcomes and impacts of all initiatives through the establishment of a monitoring and evaluation mechanism.

ANNEX 4: Subnationalizing Extractives Transparency - Ushering Participatory Governance (SET-UP-GO)

Subnationalizing Extractives Transparency - Ushering Participatory Governance (SET-UP-GO) is the PH-EITI's subnationalization program, which seeks to decentralize the implementation of EITI to communities that are affected by extractive activities, effectively letting the governance of natural resources closer to the people.

To make the subnationalization effort more concrete, it was proposed as a commitment to the Philippine Open Government Partnership (PH-OGP), which opened up its conceptualization to civil society through collaborative discourse. It was eventually included in PH-OGP's 6th National Action Plan (NAP), which spans from 2024 to 2027.

SET-UP-GO is expected to produce the following results:

- Improve the capacity of stakeholders for reporting extractives data
- Strengthen stakeholder support for EITI initiatives
- Reinforce the impact of EITI on extractives governance
- Establish a system for monitoring and reporting

Among SET-UP-GO's key features are the integration of MSG functions to Local Development Councils (LDCs) and the development of a Central Data Management Platform, where civil society can readily view EITI data from extractive companies within their immediate vicinity. The data is also expected to help guide in participatory budgeting at the local government level.
