- advancement of mining technology and geosciences
- promotion of general welfare

SDMP Allocation (DAO 2010-21)

 must be equivalent to an annual allocation of 1.5% of the company's operating cost

PHP 95 million allocated for SDMP through Health, Education, Livelihood, Public Infrastructure, and Socio-cultural programs (HELPS) (2019)

OceanaGold Philippines Inc.'s SDMP



OceanaGold Philippines worked on programs targeting Education, Environment, Health, Business Development, Training and Infrastructure.

- livelihood projects for co-ops and individual farms (enterprise development and networking program)
- educational programs and scholarships
- access to health care services













SDMP Fund Reallocation

- a five-year budgetary life cycle, continuously budgeted and undertaken depending on the life of the mines
- based on the company's forecast of operating expense as reviewed and approved by the DENR-MGB Regional Office
- unspent amount or savings is added to the succeeding year's allocation and may be reprogrammed












SDMP Fund Realignment for COVID-19 Response

- DENR Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB) issued a memorandum to realign unutilized SDMP funds to support COVID-19 response
- guidelines were released on April 1, 2020





Synthesis

The implementation of SDMP supports and creates significant changes in the lives of beneficiaries.

Nevertheless, there is still a need to **rethink** SDMP as a policy to attain more inclusivity, sustainability, and resiliency.









Inclusivity

- successful implementation of SDMP projects involves participation of community members
- participation results in better accountability of community members
- more active participation among stakeholders is needed
- local government units must be involved











Sustainability

- participation and accountability of stakeholders are important considerations in tackling the issue of dependency of communities to mining companies
- SDMP projects should be reflected on the local development agenda of beneficiary municipalities
- capacity building and empowerment of the community should be prioritized











Resiliency

projects may adopt the framework for Disaster Risk Reduction and Management

Disaster Preparedness

Establish and strengthen capacities of communities to anticipate, cope and

from the negative impacts of emergency occurrences and disasters

Disaster Response

Provide life preservation and meet the basic subsistence needs of affected population based on acceptable standards during or immediately after a disaster

Disaster Prevention and Mitigation

Avoid hazards and mitigate their potential impacts by reducing vulnerabilities and exposure and enhancing capacities of communities

Safer, adaptive and disaster resilient Filipino communities towards sustainable development

Disaster Rehabilitation and Recovery

Restore and improve facilities. livelihood and living conditions and organizational capacities of affected communities, and reduced disaster risks in accordance with the "building back better" principle
